President's Message

Celebrating HUPS

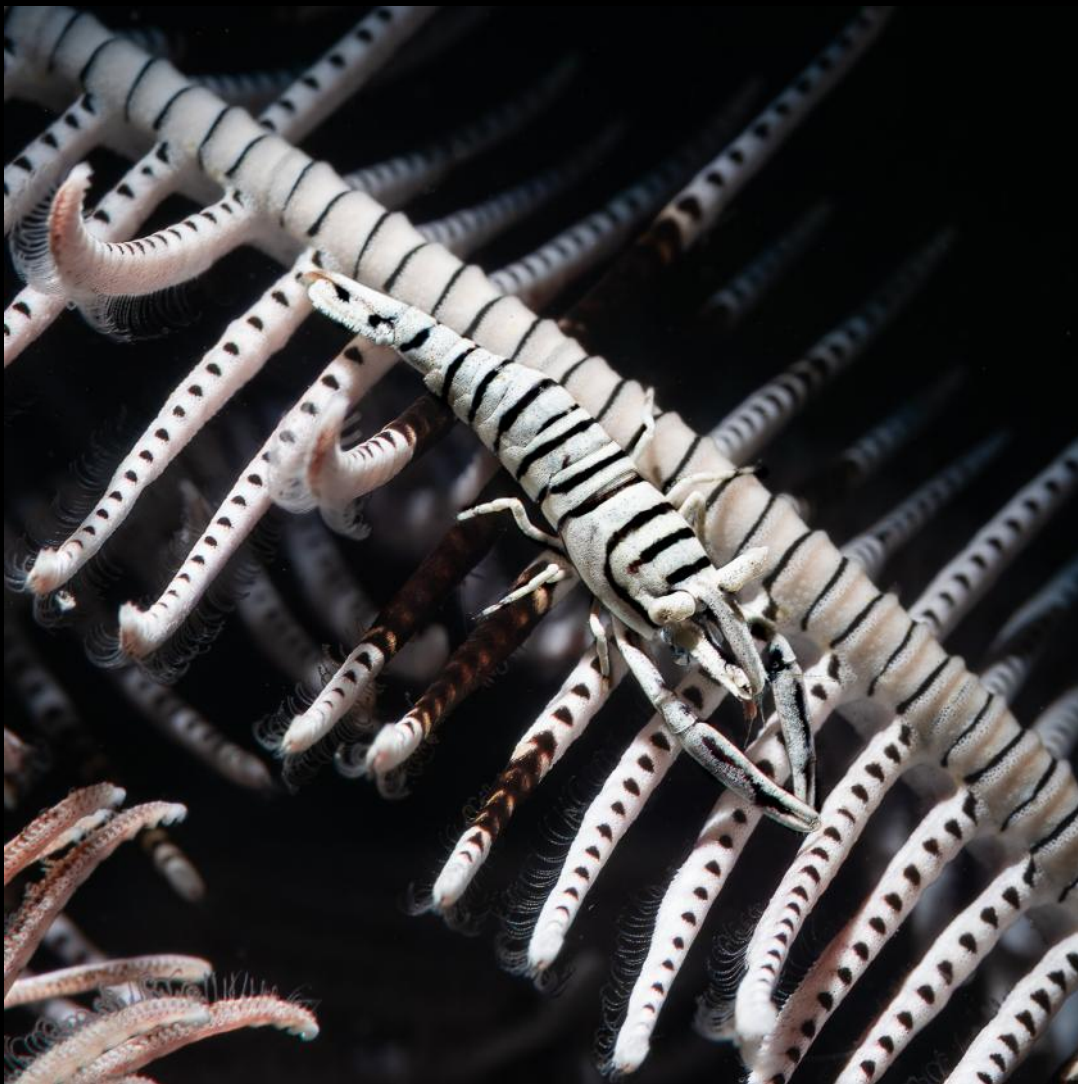

2026 Photo Contest Categories

January	Banded/Stripes	A fish or critter that has bands or stripes on their body. Detail: A pattern of parallel bands or lines on a contrasting background.
February	Crustaceans (Shrimp, Lobsters, Crabs, etc.)	Just like it says - look it up in the book (crabs, shrimp, lobsters, barnacles, etc.). When in doubt, Wikipedia can help you out.
March	Diagonal Composition	A diagonal composition is employed to arrange elements in an image based on a diagonal line.
April	Gobies, Blennies, Jaw fish, Triple fins	Tiny guys that like to hug the reef, hide out in holes, or build their nests in the sand. If you aren't sure, look it up in your fish ID book.
May	Fish with Spots or Polka Dots	A small round or roundish mark, differing in color or texture from the surface around it, such as boxfishes, coffer fishes, cowfishes and trunkfishes.
June	Eels (morays, garden, etc.)	There are lots of eels out there. They are pretty easy to spot. Think "snakes with gills".
July	Natural light	Use the sun for light (vs strobes), so lighting will be more even. Ideal for large subjects: large reefs, schools of fish, silhouettes, or large wrecks.
August	Odd-shaped bottom dwellers	If it's a bit odd looking and spends most of its life on or in the sand or reef, it probably qualifies. Infrequent-swimmers. Frogfish, crabs, flounder, scorpionfish, toadfish, batfish, lizardfish, crocodile fish...
September	Camouflage	Underwater camouflage is the set of methods of achieving crypsis—avoidance of observation—that allows otherwise visible aquatic organisms to remain unnoticed by other organisms such as predators or prey.
October	Large swimmers (> 4 feet) - not people	A fish or critter that is "swimming" with a length > 4 feet, such as: grouper, tarpon, shark, sting ray, manta ray, dolphin, moray eel
November	Hawkfish, Drums, Triggerfish	This theme gives you up to 3 possible choices of fish families. If not sure, check your fish ID book.
December	Best of HUPS	NOVICE, INTERMEDIATE, ADVANCED, and CREATIVE contests: First place winners from each month's Novice, Intermediate and Advanced categories will be entered automatically for judging. The Creative category lets you enter anything you want as long as you do the photography and any special editing.

2027 Photo Contest Categories

January	Angelfish & Butterflyfish	Pomacanthidae & Chaetodontidae are platter-flat, colorful, and pretty. If you aren't sure, look it up in your fish ID book.
February	Man-Made/Wrecks	Any large object (larger than a basketball) made by man that is on the bottom, such as: ships, planes, vehicles, etc. Avoid trash and debris.
March	Turtles	Sea Turtles, any variety – one or more. Your choice. Our air-breathing aquatic reptile buddies with the ancient pedigree.
April	Black & White (monochrome)	Mono-color images (black & white, sepia, blue-tone, etc.). Only shades of one color are allowed. Can be taken as a mono-color image straight out of the camera or edited down from full color.
May	Flat fish	It needs to have a pronounced flat profile and be a FISH: flounder, angelfish, filefish, butterflyfish, sunfish, triggerfish, etc.
June	Macro - Smaller than an orange	The subject is smaller than an orange. Can be a portion of a larger subject (eyes, fins, etc.). Should be taken with a macro lens or one that focuses close. Don't just over-crop.
July	Damselfish, Chromis, Hamlets, Basslets	A group of small fish generally 3 to 6 inches in length that have a perch like or oval profile. If you are not sure look in your fish id book.
August	Cephalopods (octopi, squid, cuttlefish)	Cephalopods are a sub-group of the phylum Mollusca (i. e., mollusks). Limit your entries to: squid, cuttlefish, octopi, and nautilus. (Not snails, slugs, clams, nudibranchs.)
September	Hogfish, Wrasses, Parrotfish, Razor	This theme gives you up to 4 possible choices of fish families. If not sure, check your fish ID book.
October	Sharks & Rays	Chondrichthyes or cartilaginous fishes are jawed fish with paired fins, paired nares, scales, two-chambered hearts, and skeletons made of cartilage rather than bone. The class is divided into two subclasses: Elasmobranchii (sharks, rays and skates) and Holocephali (chimaeras, sometimes called ghost sharks).
November	Anemones & things that live in them	Just like it says. To qualify, an anemone must be in the shot. The "things" (clownfish, crabs, etc.) are optional.
December	Best of HUPS NOVICE, INTERMEDIATE, ADVANCED, and CREATIVE contests	First place winners from each month's Novice, Intermediate and Advanced categories will be entered automatically for judging. The Creative category: Enter anything you want as long as you do the photography and any special editing.

MINI WORKSHOP FOR DAVINCI RESOLVE USERS

I just finished this Dave Edits video on YouTube where he describes and demonstrates how 10 DaVinci AI tools can be used to greatly improve the quality and ease of doing many tasks during edits. I already using several of these and plan to use more after a bit of practice. He has lots of other interesting YouTube tutorials on DaVinci Resolve. Some of what he describes below requires the latest version or maybe even the paid-for Studio version which I highly recommend... \$295 for lifetime updates.

The ones I've used so far:

- 'Finding and Displaying the Beat' - Timing video transitions to the music beat - adds impact
- 'Voice Isolation' - user selected sensitivity for noisy video clips where someone is talking
- 'Automatically adjusting the length of music clips' (longer or shorter) to fit the video length
- Removing voice, drums, or other instruments from songs
- Adding 'Smooth Cut Transitions' when removing short objectionable parts of a clip... for instance, if you have a person talking and need to eliminate pauses or flubs, a smooth cut creates frames to morph the cut so the action looks natural. You can also use it to remove those momentary blips when autofocus crawls out and back in focus (sometimes works but not on fast moving subjects). Or you're filming and a flash goes off... remove just the frames with the flash and make the action look smooth.
- 'Changing Clip Speed for Slow Motion' - Using 'AI Speed Warp' interpolates extra frames to eliminate the jerky motion that slow motion otherwise creates. When I use this, I try to make my slow motion effects in easily divisible increments like 50%, 33.3%, or 25%. It may still work for other percentage choices but it might not give really smooth results. This isn't necessary when speeding up action because DaVinci just eliminates frames (i.e., 2X, 4 X, 8 X, etc).

There are some other tools, like masking that I plan to practice and use (Like removing objectionable things in a video or adding different backgrounds). Say, you have a great clip going and someone swipes a hand or a fin in front of the action... mask it and banish it to Never Never Land. Might be useful. Or your GoPro footage has a finger or a strobe somewhere in the frame. Or a diver is in your wide angle clip and they need to disappear... click, track, delete, and they're gone.

If you're serious about videography, these are serious tools to improve quality and efficiency.

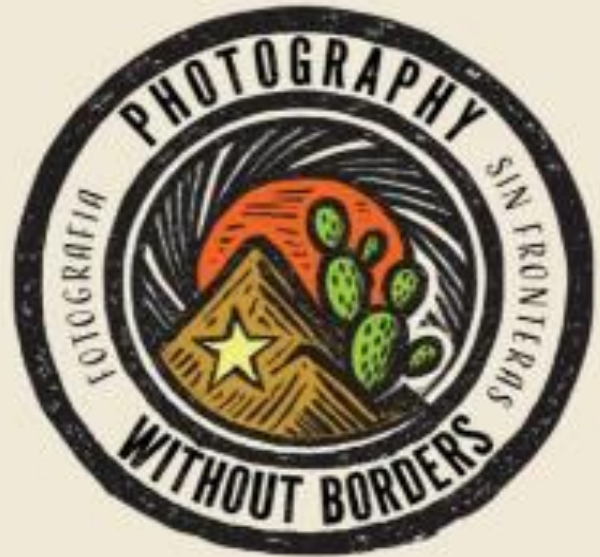

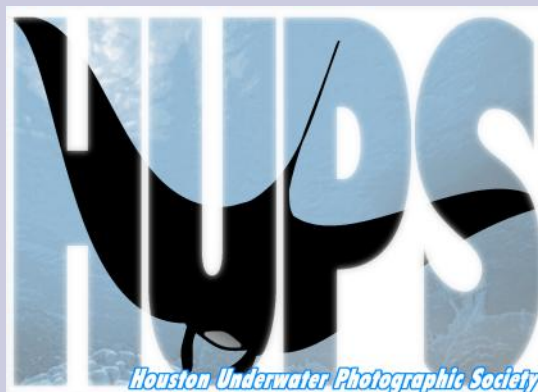
