President's Message

New Normal

'New Normal' – you hear that phrase a lot recently regarding the current economy. But what does it mean and how does it affect us? I believe that the phrase was coined last year by Bill Gross, the managing director of PIMCO, the world's largest bond fund. He is forecasting a 'New Normal' U.S. GDP growth rate of 1% - 2% per year for the foreseeable future versus a historical 3+% average growth rate. Thus, his idea of a 'New Normal' is that we will all have to do with less than we have in the past. (Of course, there are other economists who disagree with Mr. Gross and forecast a rosier picture.)

Regardless of which economic model you buy, the 'New Normal' is going to be a pain in the rear for HUPSters. NN (New Normal) already means that I can take fewer bags and less weight on airline flights to my diving destination without additional charges. NN means that there are fewer scheduled flights to those same destinations. NN means that I am going to get less for more.

I am going to get less for more, meaning more US dollars. NN means that the US dollar is worth less versus many other currencies – now my overseas dive trip cost is going to cost me more because my dollar is not worth as much. Great, so now when a beer cost \$ 9.00 AUD (Australian dollar) it does not equate to \$ 4.50 USD like it used to; it means it cost almost \$ 9.00 USD – Ouch! I like beer but \$ 9.00? NN means the price of oil is high, regardless of the fact that the world is in a recession, because crude oil is priced in USD. And, that same correlation is also relative to my hotel cost, food and everything in between. My dive trips are going to cost me more – period.

So, what can I do to better cope with the NN? (For one thing, go on HUPS dive trips – they cost less [shameless plug]). Seriously, since I must do with less, I have started down sizing the camera equipment I carry on each trip. I have a backpack that will hold a lot of stuff but it can weigh quite a bit. If the airlines are not going to allow me to carry that backpack or restrict the weight of my carry-on, I need to stop carrying every lens I own and focus on a few lenses / ports that give me good results. I will also need to pack some items into my checked bags that I used to hand carry.

Recently, I have found that I can achieve good photos with less camera gear. I have settled on two lenses and one port that cover most of my u/w photographic needs. Currently, I use a10-17 mm wide angle lens and a 17-70 mm macro lens, along with a single 6" dome port that accommodates either lens. This reduction in the number of lenses and ports that I carry does not reduce my overall weigh by much but it is part of a philosophy of making do with less

Carrying that same philosophy over to my scuba gear, I have started thinking in terms of layering. I can't afford to pack multiple wetsuits, so now I pack a core warmer (similar to a shorty); put that on under a 3 mil and you have a 6/3 wetsuit. Next I am going to look for a new dive bag as my old bag is just about worn out. Maybe I can save some weight by getting a duffel bag instead of a big heavy dive bag. Let's see, where else can I reduce weight? Clothes – don't need many clothes on a dive trip. Laptop – got to have my laptop; however, there may be a replacement for that also as tablet computers are on the horizon and that would be nifty.

In any event, I have to stop packing the kitchen sink and start thinking about traveling light. The current economic environment is going to force me to carry less or pay more. Well, I did say that my dive trips are going to cost me more; I guess that will be just a fact of life in the NN world.

HUPS Invited to Participate in George W. Glennie Nature Interclub Exhibition

HUPS has received an invitation to participate in the George W. Glennie Nature Interclub Exhibition conducted by the Merrimack Valley Camera Club of North Andover, Massachusetts. Last year, our first year of participation, HUPS placed 5th out of 95 participating clubs from across the United States and several foreign countries. Two members, Tom Collier and Dennis Deavenport, won individual awards: Tom was best in the Marine Category and Dennis won a Merit Award in that category. Last year, entries were selected from those displayed at the Texas Dive Show at the Reliant Center. This year, we will use those photos submitted for the Moody Gardens display, but we will also solicit additional

photos from those who may not have sent a photo in for that

The Exhibition is open to all camera clubs and similar organizations world-wide; all are most welcome to join in as a means of sharing some of the seldom seen or observed scenes of the world that we inhabit with the broadest audience possible. It provides all clubs with the opportunity to participate to give a broad spectrum of Nature specimens submitted for the information and enjoyment of all. This is also one of the few opportunities that photographers may gain well-deserved recognition for their efforts, regardless of subject. This is due to the fact that individual. as well as club awards are presented in a very wide range of categories.

The criteria that an image must meet to be considered nature photography are those of the Photographic Society of America (PSA) for Nature Photography at

http://www.glennie-exhibition.com/nature%20def.html. This document also defines what adjustments may be made to an image. Also of interest is that the judges will weigh the story telling value of a photograph more than the pictorial quality. For examples, the photos from 2009 can be viewed at http://www.glennie-exhibition.com/. You will see that the winning photos generally featured animal behavior, rather than just being a wildlife portrait (although they are of generally high pictorial quality as well).

Of special interest this year is a new category - close up photography of specimens that are typically small, (insects and their larvae as well as fungi, flower blossoms, seed pods and microbes - and I would add marine creatures like nudibranchs, anenome shrimp, pygmy seahorses, etc). In general these photos were not submitted or selected for Moody Gardens, and we would like to have two or three of our 10 submissions meet this criteria.

Images should be submitted as 1024 x 768 pixel (maximum dimensions) JPG's at 72 dpi or higher resolution not to exceed 1 MB file size. This will also be be adequate for final submission for the exhibition. Images should be sent to Jan Baughman at jbaughman@juno.com in January. Jan will organize a selection committee, and final selections will be made in February and submitted in March. Contact Jim Heimer at hupsweb@earthlink.net if you have any questions.


